## Parish Health Ministry

### **Black Lung and Respiratory Health Clinic**

The Black Lung and Respiratory Health Clinic is open to any adult living in the Genesis Service areas or surrounding counties who has any breathing problems. There are different areas available to assist clients.

1. Clinic program:

The medical director is available on Thursday mornings to conduct an examination and order a few tests to determine the level of impairment.

2. Support Groups:

Better Breathing Club helps clients cope with breathing difficulties and have fun!

3. Pulmonary Rehabilitation:

Classes consist of education and monitored exercise. Respiratory therapists, physical therapists, pharmacists, intuitionists, and social services all participate.

4. Black Lung Claim:

Assistance is given in applying for Black lung Benefit claims. Department of Labor representatives are available.

The goal of the clinic is to help clients breathe better and improve the quality of life.

The Black Lung and Respiratory Health Clinic is partially funded through grants from the Ohio Department of Health and Human Services. No one is turned away because of inability to pay. Financial assistance may be provided for clients meeting eligibility requirements. Private insurance and Medicare are also accepted.

You may be referred to the clinic by your doctor or can call and set up an appointment on your own. Call 740-454-4063 or 1-800-322-4762, Ext. 4063 and ask for Shirley, Michelle, or Yvonne. The clinic is located in Genesis Bethesda Hospital just around the main lobby floor of the Physicians Pavilion at 2951 Maple Ave.

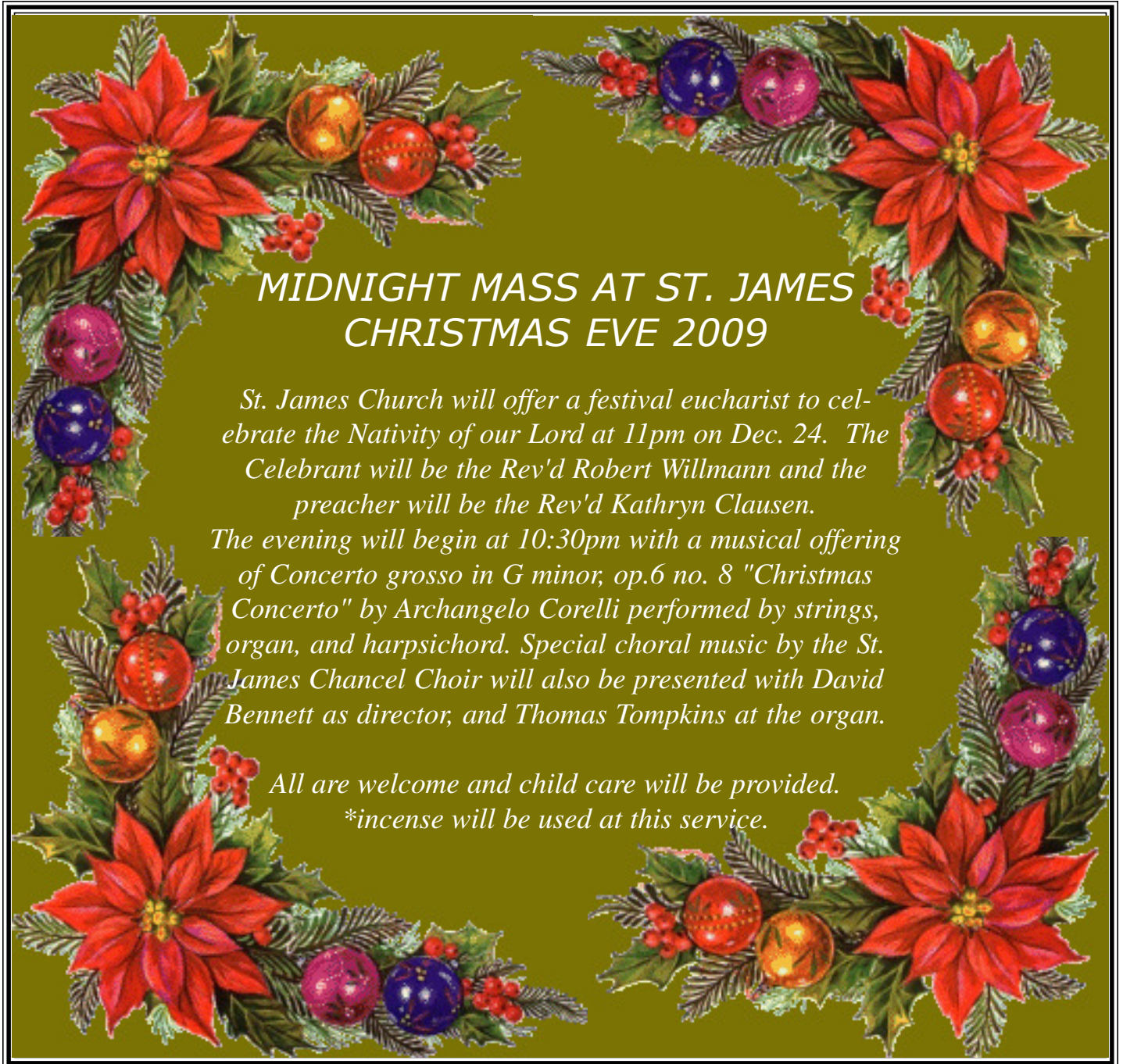

## VESTRY NOTES

NOVEMBER 18, 2009

Attending: K. Clausen, R. Howell, Rob Willmann, John Benson, Barbara Saunders, Sherry Gillespie, Carol Cavinee, Eleanor Bailey, Leigh Mantell, Mark Haven, Rick Meyer, Maria Willmann. Absent: Paul Reichardt. Guest: Dan Beebe

- Christmas Caroling will take place December 13 starting at 3 pm. Rob Willmann will accompany them. ECW will provide refreshments at the end. A list of persons will be developed.
- The senior warden announced the call of Fr. Rob Willmann as our next rector effective Jan. 1, 2010. Details of the contract are being discussed.
- The vestry approved adding Rev'd Clausen's photo to the list of previous rectors in the narthex.
- The estimates for restoration of the chapel floor were deferred.
- The new ovens have been installed. The old ones are being given to the installer as payment for the cost of the installation. Jeff Lanning is preparing instructions for the use of convection ovens.
- Quotes are being gathered for some electrical repairs, including an outlet in the choir for the amplifier and upgrading of wiring in the choir and sanctuary areas.
- The next Lantern will announce Fr. Willmann's call

- Transition plans will include joint celebration of Christmas services at both Trinity and St. James, regular altar exchanges after an initial period of adjustment to new assignments, a joint vestry retreat with Trinity early in the spring using diocesan leader, and a variety of joint projects.. It was agreed that Rev'd Clausen will be listed as priest associate at St. James and Fr. Willmann at Trinity as a demonstration of our continuing relationships.
- Endowment showed a slight decline in October.
- Vestry approved proposed change of by-laws about eligibility to run for vestry. Currently it requires pledge. This is proposed to be changed to pledge, time and/or talent. It will be on the agenda for the annual meeting.
- There was discussion of the bishop's announcement at convention that he will permit same-sex blessings. No priest will be required to perform them. They must consult with congregations if considering it. The bishop must give approval.
- Liturgy plans for Advent and Christmas were discussed. Four new acolytes will be included in the Christmas Eve service. There will be string ensemble and special choral presentations.
- Fr. Dower will supply November 22 and 29.
- Two more baptisms are planned before the end of the year.
- Christmas Eve will be the final service for Rev'd Clausen. Fr. Willmann will preside on Dec. 27 at the baptism.
- Twenty radio ads were donated by a parishioner. They will announce the Christmas Eve services.
- Thanksgiving services were announced for the 24th and 25th.
- The vestry approved a donation to ECSF (Episcopal Charitable Services) from the Geyer fund.
- Mission Share for 2010 was approved. It is less than previous years.
- The treasurer's report was approved. Overall, we are still within budget.
- The treasurer announced a budget process to begin Dec. 1. It will be open to input from all interested parties. The first budget should be ready for the December Vestry. If needed, the January vestry can meet before the annual meeting to finalize it.
- Outreach reported a very generous Second Basket collection in October for the "dry bottoms" program in Cambridge. The November collection will go to families for Christmas. The December collection will go to the Friendship Dinner. Eastside sent an accounting of assistance given out of our Escrow account there. Most of it was for electric bills.
- There was an update on stewardship pledges so far. We have not yet met our

goal but 15 pledges still have not been received.

- *Fr. Willmann and Rev'd Clausen will be doing pastoral calling together so he can be introduced to people.*
- *Christian education continues a series on the historical Jesus for the adult forum. The children's Sunday School is very active now. There were 15 children in the Sunday School on Nov. 15.*
- *Shrove Tuesday plans are starting. Advance tickets will be \$6, and \$7 at the door.*
- *ECW may consider joint projects with Newark ECW. Hera at St. James a spring project will be to stock pantry for Friendship Dinner.*
- *Rev'd Clausen presented a long list of outstanding keys. After the first of the year, the locks may be changed.*
- *The Meyers were thanked for hosting a very lively and successful Newcomer's dinner.*

Next vestry is Dec. 16.

And now, in my adult years, St. James continues to be an integral part of my religious life as I strive to continue on the pathway as being

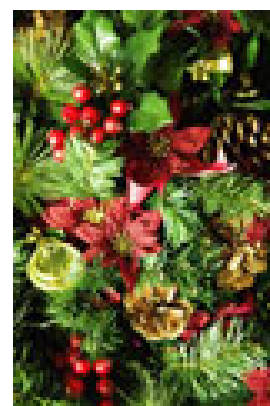
one of God's children.

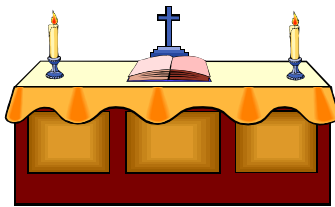
