This September will be different from others because this month we will be commemorating one of the most horrendous days in our nations history: 9/11/01.

Like most epic tragedies we can probably all remember where we were when this sad event unfolded.

I was away on vacation in Miami, Florida staying with a priest classmate. We were watching the Today Show that morning when the unbelievable news came on. It was absolutely terrifying to watch what was being shown before our eyes.

Our Rectory was in the flight path of Miami International Airport, with sounds of planes constant. Then suddenly they all stopped.

Two things stand out in my mind from this. First and foremost, the courage and heroism of so many good people. People that thought nothing of their own lives to save others. People who saved loved ones and people that lost loved ones. No doubt we will in the next few weeks be reliving this terrible event but what should stand out for us is that the goodness of humanity triumphed over evil.

The second thing is, that evil is a very real presence in humanity. We hear blurbs of incidents everyday in the news that boggles our imagination. But this event is almost beyond compare. This is more than about making mistakes or wrong choices or even being rude or cruel to someone. This about the reality that there are people who have given themselves over to a power that is intent on the destruction of the human person in mass. It is a power that lies beyond the individual but it relies on the individual to cooperate in order to bring its destruction here.

One may ask: how can this be?

The answer is rather simple. This begins, as Jesus says, in the human heart. This is where our capability to choose good or evil begins. And, brothers and sisters, it starts small. It starts in the little decisions

we make everyday and it adds up over the course of a lifetime. Who was it that said: our personhood ends up defined by the summation of our choices in life.

The Church is important for many reasons but especially because Jesus himself gave us the church to be a moral compass so that people can know right from wrong. So that parents can know and then train their children to know. It's not hard to understand then why it is a concern when people feel they don't need to go to church. Where are they going to get this moral formation? What will happen to the future of our country if people don't receive knowledge about the values of character, principles and love?

The next few weeks are going to be a solemn time for our country. We will remember and pay tribute to the dead. We will mourn for those who lost their lives to save others. We will disdain the evil that caused this and we will celebrate the triumph of good over evil.

Remember, however, that good is not formed in a vacuum. Its presence cannot be presumed. It is the benefit of sound formation of the human person in moral principles based upon the Commandments of God and the Holy Gospels.

Where people that cooperate with evil become confused is: They think that this action will overcome a government or an edifice or a particular people so that a new form of what they destroy may be put in place.

In the end the goal of evil is not to destroy buildings or governments, which may be a symbol of a certain nations power. The goal of evil is to annihilate the human person.

This clever power intends destruction not only for the intended target but also for the very persons who have chosen freely to collaborate with it as its instruments in this world.

9/11 10th Anniversary Request from Executive Council

The following is a copy of a Resolution adopted by the Executive Council at its meeting from June 15 - 17, 2011 in Linthicum Heights, Maryland, at which a quorum was present and voting.

RESOLVED, That the Executive Council of The Episcopal Church, meeting in Linthicum Heights, Maryland, from June 15-17, 2011, invites Episcopal communities of all kinds to open the doors of their institutions the weekend of September 10 and 11, 2011 to commemorate the 10th Anniversary of the attacks with acts of prayer and remembrance, service, creativity, inter-faith cooperation, education, community building, and fellowship, offering our institutions as active, accessible sites of healing for our local communities.



A SPECIAL INVITATION

Trinity Episcopal Church, Newark, is offering a special service to honor police, firefighters, and emergency services for their dedication to the safety of the public. It will also be a memorial to those who lost their lives in the line of duty.

The service is sometimes called a "blue mass" but is, in actuality, a memorial service based on the burial office and Holy Eucharist of the Episcopal Church. It is planned for Sunday, September 11 at 4pm., at Trinity Episcopal Church, 76 East Main Street just east of the courthouse. The service will be solemn and dignified with combined choirs representing Trinity, St. James Zanesville, St. John's Lancaster and First Methodist Church in Newark. It will be open to the public but is especially intended for the officers in the various services.

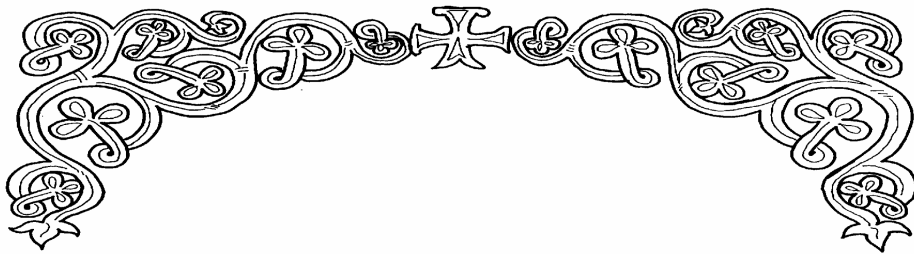


Choir practice
